



DURANT PARK - A lovely square dominated by a decorative arch at the Southeast corner of Washington Avenue and Saginaw Streets in Lansing, Michigan was once the homesite of Mortimer Cowles. Abandoned by his heirs, the property was purchased by William C. Durant, who produced the Durant and Star autos in Lansing after his association with General Motors ended. Durant gave the park to the City of Lansing in 1921.
